

Dr. Stephanie Mueller is a clinician-investigator within the Division of General Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital (BWH), and an Assistant Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School, where she works as a hospitalist and conducts research on hospital-based care transitions. She completed her medical school training at University of Massachusetts in 2005, followed by internal medicine residency and chief residency at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston. She pursued fellowship training at the Harvard General Medicine Fellowship where she earned a Masters of Public Health, prior to joining as faculty at BWH in 2012. Dr. Mueller is a nationally recognized expert in hospital-based care transitions with grant-funded research focused on improving the quality and safety of inter-hospital transfers. She has over 15 publications and has received national recognition awards related to her research. In addition to her research activities, Dr. Mueller has a strong passion for mentoring and faculty development particularly among women. She serves as both the Associate Director of Clinical Research and Director of Mentorship and Promotion for the BWH Hospital Medicine Unit where she won an award for Excellence in Mentoring, is the current faculty chair for the Joint Committee on the Status of Women (JCSW), and is actively involved in the Society of Hospital Medicine where she serves as the co-chair for the local chapter, and has conducted several workshops on women in medicine and implicit bias at the annual national conference.
